
Trinity Christian Academy College Day Approval Form

High school students may take three (3) college visitation days during their junior year and three (3) during their senior year. The student named below will be using a college day on the date indicated. The student is required to notify each of his/her teachers prior to this date and is responsible for any make up work or missed assignments.



Lines 1 and 2 should be completed prior to turning in for approval by the Secondary Principal. Students must receive administrative approval no less than one week prior to the date of college visit. It is the student's responsibility to get any assignments that will be missed during the visit. It is also the student's responsibility to have this form signed by a college representative and return the completed form to the secondary office on the first day back to school following the college day. If this form is not returned the following day with a college representative signature, an absence will be recorded; otherwise college days do not count as an absence.

College days will not be approved for dates during the final three weeks of either the fall or spring semesters.

Please remember that college days are a privilege and should be used solely for the purpose of visiting colleges that a student has a genuine interest in attending. If the visit is to an area college, or if the visit will only take a short while, students should plan to attend school as usual for as much of the school day as possible. In other words, please do not miss an entire day to visit a school in Fort Worth or Weatherford unless you have a full schedule of events, meetings, observations, etc. planned at that campus!

Here are a few things you might want to investigate/consider during your college visit!

- 1. Explore the following important buildings on campus: dorms, cafeteria, student center, bookstore(s), and library.
- 2. When is the admission application deadline for the semester you want to enroll?
- 3. When is the scholarship deadline for the semester you want to enroll?
- 4. What will tuition and fees amount to in an average semester?
- 5. Is there a minimum SAT or ACT score for admission? What is it?
- 6. What degrees are offered that might interest you?
- 7. What is the *feel* of the campus? (friendly/welcoming or businesslike? urban or rural? conservative or liberal? etc.)
- 8. Where are student ministry centers? Is there one of your denomination or one that interests you?
- 9. What are some fun campus activities that you might want to participate in? (intramurals, student government, campus organizations, etc.)
- 10. What is the city/town like?
- 11. How long does it take to get home from here?
- 12. If you may not have a car while on campus, will you be able to get where you need to go (grocery stores, church, etc.)?
- 13. Do your parents like the campus? (yes, that is an important consideration⁽²⁾!)
