PSAT SAT Preparation Classes 2015

<u>SAT/ new PSAT (College Board) Preparation Classes</u> for high school students (grades 9-12) will meet once a week for 8 weeks. Eighth grade students who have completed Algebra 1 may also enroll. The Preparation Course includes an Orientation Class, summer vocabulary quiz mail-ins, the 8 two-hour classes, two books, and weekly class packets of practice exercises. Actual PSAT tests are provided for additional practice for PSAT students. The cost for the PSAT/SAT Prep Course is **\$400.00**. *

The Essay Classes are scheduled for Tuesday, June 2nd, 7-8:30 pm (part 1) and Saturday, August 22nd, 9-10:30 am (part 2). Both held at Grace Prep Academy at 3300 W I-20, Arlington, TX 76017. If you register for the Essay Writing Class, please add \$40.00 to your check (add only \$32.00 if a Trinity Christian student).

<u>REGISTRATION</u> – Submit registration form with \$150.00 registration fee (If taking Essay class, registration fee is \$190.00) to secure your place for the 8 week course. <u>For discounts</u> registration <u>and</u> payment in full must be received **BY APRIL 30**th. TUITION BALANCE: If not paying in full by April 30th to receive the discount, the **balance amount of \$250.00** is due at the first **August class**. Please understand that the economics of maintaining small, effective classes does not allow for either reduced payments or refunds for missed classes, whether planned or unplanned.

GENERAL INFORMATION: The Writing (grammar) preparation includes review of punctuation, grammar, sentence structure, and common usage errors. The Critical Reading preparation includes an intense vocabulary study (including Latin and Greek prefixes, suffixes, and roots), as well as a study of successful test taking strategies for the Sentence Completion and Reading Passages portions of the test. The Math preparation reviews the Geometry and the more extensive Algebra covered on the SAT, as well as time saving shortcuts and helpful strategies, such as back solving and using special numbers. General test-taking strategies are also taught. Weekly assignments include readings, vocabulary memorization, reworking math problems, and review of class notes. Weekly at home SAT /PSAT Practice Tests are an integral part of this course, providing the student an opportunity to practice each week's newly learned skills. The Orientation Class, Writing Class, and summer vocabulary memorization schedule are designed to help students accomplish as much work as possible before the busy fall semester begins. The 8 week Preparation Course, designed with the most effective timing in mind, begins the week of August 10th (Aug. 8th for the Saturday class) and is scheduled for completion immediately preceding the SAT test date of October 3rd and PSAT test date October 14th.

Q. Why take a PSAT/SAT Preparation class?

Unlike in years past, today most serious students preparing for their college education are taking a preparatory class to increase their college entrance exam scores. These students will have an advantage over those who do not take one.

- •As a **Junior** to compete for National Merit Scholar status and the increased scholarships that come with it.
- •As a **Sophomore** and/or a **Freshman** (as long as you have completed Algebra I) because:
- o The course content is jam-packed and it is unlikely ALL the information will be retained from taking the course only once.
- o The mathematics, critical reading skills, grammar, and vocabulary taught in the course help students in their regular academic courses, potentially increasing GPA.
- o There is a much higher probability of achieving National Merit status when the course is taken two (2) or even three (3) times. Most of my Commended students, National Merit Semi-finalists, Finalists, Scholars, and students making perfect scores, have taken the course at least twice.
- o Some students begin preparing as **Eighth Graders**. (Completion of Algebra I is a pre-requisite.)
